Seminar and Endowment Programme

Workshop on Integrated Management of Weeds in Onion and Vegetable crops



Dr. D. Rajagopal, Vice-President, IAT, Bangalore inaugurated the workshop on Integrated Management of Weeds in Onion and Vegetables at Kasavarahatty in Chitradurga District. From L to R: Dr. A.G. One day workshop on "Integrated Management of Weeds in Onion and Vegetable crops" was organized by IAT Bangalore in co-ordination with IAT chapter Chitradurga, Departments of Horticulture and Agriculture, Krishi Vignana Kendra Babbur farm, Hiriyur on 17-07-2015 at Kasavarahatty Village Community Hall Chitradurga Taluk. This workshop was organized under the endowment grants allocated from Asia Pacific Weeds Science Society (APWSS), IAT Bangalore. Sri L.H Ramachandra Reddy President, Hale Dyamavvanahally Grama Pachayath, Chitradurga district presided over the function.

Dr. D. Rajagopal, Vice President and Chair Person of Seminar and Endowment Sub-Committee of IAT Bangalore, inaugurated the workshop by lighting the lamp along with other guests. Dr. T.V. Muniyappa, Professor of Agronomy, (Retd) University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore and Member, Board of

Management UHS Bagalkot, Dr. T.V. Ramachandra Prasad, Professor of Agronomy (Retd) UAS, Bangalore. Sri. Channabasavaiah, Co-opted member, IAT Bangalore participated as Resource persons in the workshop. Dr. E. Jayarama Reddy President IAT Chitradurga, Dr. H. Chandrappa, Dr. S. Omkarappa along with Scientists from Babbur farm, Sri Thimma Reddy, Progressive farmer, Sri Vijayakumar MYRADA Organization were the Chief guests of the workshop.

Dr. Rajagopal, during his inaugural address he described that the "Weed is a plant which is out of place" and these weeds have been classified as annual, biannual, perennial, noxious or obnoxious weeds. Further he explained that the weeds are nuisance to the crop growth which are generally competing with the main crop by absorbing the soil nutrients, moisture and space which resulted in poor growth of the crops as well as harbouring the variety of pests and diseases which

are going to damage at all stages of crop growth. Now a days, due to scarcity of labourers, use of herbicides has become inevitable during the cultivation of any crops. He also mentioned about various herbicides either as pre-emergent or post emergent which are readily available in the market.

Dr. T.V. Ramachandra Prasad, who has participated as one of the Resource persons in the workshop explained the various methodology in application of herbicides for managing the weeds in onion and other vegetable crops. He has given the most useful recommendations to the farmers on Pre emergent herbicides such as, Oxyfluofen 23.5 EC @ 200 ml per acre or Pendimethilin 30 EC at 1 lit. per acre in 300 lit. of water and they should be applied within 3 days after sowing or planting.

Regarding the application of Post emergent herbicides against weeds in Onion and other vegetable crops Oxyfluofen 23.5 EC @ 200 ml per acre or Quizelopop Ethyl 5 EC @ 300 ml per cre in 200 lit. of water. The post emergent herbicide should be applied during 25-30 days He has also explained the direct of crop growth. application of herbicides in Pomegranate, Coconut, Arecanut and other plantation crops, where he recommended the application of herbicides like glyphosate 41 SL @ 10 ml per lit. of water + 2-3 drops of lime juice or Glyphosphate 71 SG @ 7.5 g per lit. of water + 2-3 drops of lime juice. Further he has clarified several queries raised by the farmers especially on the control of Cuscata stem parasite by Pendimethilin at 1 lit. per 200 lit. of water, 10 days after sowing or planting. Dr. T.V. Muniyappa another expert on Weed Management, who explained on the history and development of herbicides against weeds including the

Introduction of herbicide like 2-4 D where he experimented with *Parthenium* management at UAS Hebbal and GKVK campuses. Further he had stressed upon various components of Integrated Weed Management such as hand weeding, intercultivation, timely application of herbicides etc. Further he also said about the timely weed management is the most important aspect of crop cultivation which enhances the Agri. production.

Resource persons from Bangalore and Scientists from Babbur farm, Hiriyur briefly explained through PPT on the occurrence of various weeds, attack of insect pests and Diseases in Onion and Vegetable Crops at different stages of the crops and management practices followed at different stages along with the names of the herbicides to be used and their dosages of mixing with water and spray with precautions.

The Scientists advised farmers to follow some tips while doing Agricultural practices. Some of them are crop rotation, timely intercultural operations, cultivation practices, following the package of practices, minimizing the input costs, intercropping. etc. Some companies have participated in the workshop by exhibiting the Agri. implements especially the tractor, tillers, ploughs, rotary weeders power tillers etc. Dr. Doddamallaiah. Dr. J. Thippeswamy and other IATians from Chitradurga participated in the workshop. Dr. A.G. Ramachandra Reddy President of Programme Committee welcomed the guests and Dr. C. Thippeswamy proposed the vote of the thanks. About 100 farmers from different villages participated in the daylong workshop.

Extension Education and Training Programmes

1) Organized Farmers Meeting to build Confidence against Committing Suicide

A preliminary meeting was conducted on 29-7-2015 at Coleman Hall, Zonal Agricultural Research Station V.C Farm, Mandya, for building confidence against committing suicide under the Presidentship of Dr.H.Shivanna, Vice Chancellor, UAS Bangalore with the joint collaboration of IAT Bangalore and UAS Bangalore. Dr. K.V. Sarvesh, President, IAT Bangalore participated as Chief guest.

Dr. K.V. Sarvesh expressed his deep concern about series of farmers suicides committed in the state and in particular in Mandya district where Farmers suicide is found to be maximum compared to other districts even though Mandya area is an irrigated belt. He further explained necessity for conducting a farmers meeting at Mandya to build confidence, strength and courage to farmers so that the farmers must understand committing suicide is not the final solution to solve their problems. He further briefed that the IAT has decided to conduct such farmers meetings in many parts of the state and requested the Vice Chancellor to collaborate in organizing such programmes in Mandya and other centres in Karnataka.

Mr. Boraiah, a progressive farmer and a member of Rajya Raitha Sangha appreciated the concern of IAT and UAS Bangalore to conduct such farmers meeting at Mandya. He briefed about different problems faced by

the farmers growing sugarcane, paddy and other crops in Mandya district and appealed to the organizers to concentrate on genuine problems of Farmers which is leading to take extreme steps for suicides.

Dr K.T. Shivashankar, Professor of Horticulture (Rtd) UAS, Bangalore and President, Mandya Agri and allied Sciences Graduate Association stressed upon the necessity for conducting farmers meeting to build confidence against farmers committing suicide particularly in Mandya District.

Dr. Shivanna, Vice Chancellor, UAS, Bangalore briefed about the various steps initiated by UAS Bangalore in building confidence with farmers against their suicide. He appreciated the efforts of IAT who have come forward to organize the farmers meeting for building confidence against farmers suicide and expressed full support of UAS Bangalore in collaborating such programmes. He suggested to conduct such farmers meeting as early as possible and appealed to all the scientists of ZARS, KVK and College of Agriculture, Mandya to join with IAT in organizing such programmes in the interest of farming community.

The training on Borewell Recharge and Rain Water Harvesting as well as practical demonstration is very useful progamme in increasing Groundwater level in the Borewells by conserving rain water, since the rainfall is scarce and untimely in these days. Technology will be more useful and food production can be increased by adopting such new technologies to feed the increasing population. He was also concerned about migrating of Agricultural labourers from villages to cities.

Dr. K.V. Sarvesh, President, IAT, Bangalore who participated as one of the Special invitees explained the various soil and water conservation development activities implemented at village level by Watershed Development Department like increase of groundwater table in the borewells, control of unnecessary wastage of water stored in the tanks, soil and water conservation in cultivable and fallow lands. He appealed to the farmers to increase groundwater table in the borewells by adopting new technologies as well as to adopt Integrated Farming System to increase their income.

Sri. Rangaswamy, ZP member, Gudemaranahally informed the farmers about the provisions made under MNAREGA scheme to increase the groundwater table in Borewells. In all the above places Dr. Margoob Hussain, Animal Gynecologist and M.C. member of IAT and Doctors from the Department of Animal Husbandry have attended Animal Health Checkups and treated the animals for various problems like infertility, FMD, Deworming and other clinical problems.

Dr. Margoob Hussain further explained various problems and diseases observed in cows and other animals, and their management practices. He also explained methods of good calf care, good Animal health care and increasing milk production. More than 1900 Animals have been treated in the above mentioned places. Farmers of the respective places and students of UAS Bangalore under RAWE programme participated in the programme.

Knowledge Enhancement Programmes

1) Reemployment and Bhima Varishta Pension Benefits




