A Borewell Recharge Training Programme was conducted on 14-7-2014 at the Government High School Avverahalli under the Chairmanship of Smt. Dr. M.V. Venkatesh, Chief Executive Officer, ZP, Ramanagara inaugurated the programme. He expressed concern over depleting water level in the borewells year by year mainly because of unscientific and indiscriminate use of borewell water. He was also very critical about destruction of trees, forests, Gomals, growing only eucalyptus and Acacia plants. Urbanisation have lead into all these problems. He appealed to farmers to conserve as much as rain water through various water conservation and water harvesting structures. He appreciated the efforts of IAT in tackling these problems by arranging awareness programme

Training Programme on Bee Keeping and

Marketing of Honey

IAT Regional Chapter, Bagalkot, Directorate of Extension, University of Horticultural Sciences(UHS) Bagalkot and Karnataka Vikas Grameena Bank, Bagalkot have jointly organized a one day training programme on Beekeeping and marketing of Honey at UHS Bagalkot on 13th August 2014. The programme was attended by thirty beneficiaries from the districts of Bagalkot, Bijapur, Dharwad and other districts. Dr. J. Venkatesh, Director of Research, UHS Baglakot inaugurated the training programme by lighting the lamp. In his inaugural address, he said that the Beekeeping activity can be taken up in Maidan areas also in addition to Malnad areas. Further he stated that the Honeybees plays an important role in the cross pollination of different crops and the farmers could get better yields by keeping the Beehives during the flowering periods.

Dr. A.B. Patil, President, IAT Regional Chapter, Bagalkot and the Director of Extension, UHS, Bagalkot in his introductory speech expressed that, the farmers could get income throughout the year by practicing beekeeping, out of honey and bye products of honeybees. He further stated that farmers can get 20-25% higher yields by the pollination of crops through honey bees.

Sri. S.M. Shanthaveeraiah, ADA (Retd.) and Beekeeping Expert, participated as main resource person in the Training Programme and said that there is lot to learn from the beekeeping activity. He demonstrated identification of honevbee castes, social system, management of honeybees, food collection etc. to the participating beneficiaries. Sri. The input dealers were also requested to utilise the services of retired technologists either from Agriculture Department or from UAS as consultants to safeguard the interest of farming community.

Dr. Arun Balamatti, Vice President, IAT Mysore chapter, emphasised in his opening remarks that the state extension machinery is not able to meet the growing information needs of the vast farming population for various reasons and hence, the input traders are becoming the major source of information as well as agricultural inputs. Hence, in order to succeed and sustain as entrepreneurs, the input traders need to know the latest developments on agricultural technologies, especially the new pesticide molecules, in order to offer the best product at reasonable price to maintain their competitive edge. Also, going by the Green Revolution experiences, he said we cannot continue to overuse of agro chemicals for reasons of adding to the increasing production costs to farmers and the adverse impact of agro chemicals on the environment. Thus, there is a need for the input traders
